### MANAGER'S REPORT

What an interesting, challenging and rewarding July 2019-June 2020 period it has been. Where to start? Last year was amazing. Through the efforts of staff, committee and volunteers we pulled off some great events and programs. One of the highlights for me was the Tatura Women's Breakfast held at Hill Top Golf Club with guest speaker Tracey Sofra. It was so wonderful to see close to 100 of our mainly local women, friends and colleagues come together in Tatura to be "inspired and empowered" and enjoy each other's company. A special thanks to Sue Moreton who worked tirelessly on this event!



The new library is a huge project, there have been many months of dust, noise and cold draughts. The end result is looking amazing and I can't wait to welcome our community back through our front doors via the new beautiful shared foyer. I am also delighted that in that last reporting period Council upgraded the rear carpark, making it safe and accessible for both the Children's Centre and Community House visitors. The new Cubby Occasional Care verandah, walkway and fence have been a great upgrade, providing much needed privacy, protection and safety.

At the end of 2019 I took 6 weeks off, travelling interstate and overseas for some much needed relaxation and down time. I came back early February feeling fit and rested and enthusiastic about the year to come. This, I guess, brings us to the second half of the reporting year, when the world and our communities were turned on their head. On the 25<sup>th</sup> January the first case of novel coronavirus (Covid 19) had been confirmed in Victoria. As of the 23<sup>rd</sup> September 2020 there have been over 31 million cases worldwide and 967 164 deaths. Here in Victoria, we have had 20 112 cases and 773 deaths.

On the 18<sup>th</sup> March the Committee of Management held a Special Committee Meeting to create a contingency plan around Covid19. By the 25<sup>th</sup> March I had closed the doors to the public as required by the State ordered restrictions and since then the Community House's operations and programs have taken on a whole new dimension. Zoom meetings, social distancing, masks, working from home, staggering staff and experiencing the Covid test and waiting anxiously for results, all part and parcel of the new Covid world order.

I could not be prouder of our team at TCH. Firstly, The Cubby Childcare staff led by Tarja, were mandated to stay open and had to manage community concern as well as taking on the extra processes and hygiene requirements to ensure a Covid safe environment. Janenne, Karen and Tarja have supported each other through this tough journey, ensuring that The Cubby remains open to families.

Nadine and Tom have been critical in keeping the Community House rolling along in these last 6 months, taking on jobs such as archiving, improving our online presence as well as contributing to the Helping Hand Project. Thankyou both for your dedication, creativity and enthusiasm.

The Committee of Management have provided strong governance through this time and I really value the trust and positive working arrangements that we have developed over the past 4 years.



### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2020

#### 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

These financial statements are special purpose financial statements prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Reform Act 2012 (Vic). The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial statements have been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuations of non-current assets.

#### (a) Income Tax

No provision for income tax has been raised as the entity is exempt from income tax under Div 50 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997.

#### (b) Property, Plant and Equipment

Each class of property, plant and equipment is carried at cost or fair value less, where applicable, any accumulated depreciation and impairment losses.

The carrying amount of plant and equipment is reviewed annually by the committee to ensure it is not in excess of the recoverable amount from these assets. The recoverable amount is assessed on the basis of expected net cash flows that will be received from the asset's employment and subsequent disposal. The expected net cash flows have been discounted to present values in determining recoverable amounts.

#### Depreciation

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at the end of each reporting period. An asset's carrying amount is written down immediately to its recoverable amount if the asset's carrying amount is greater than its estimated recoverable amount.

#### (c) Accounts Receivable and Other Debtors

Accounts receivable and other debtors include amounts due from members as well as amounts receivable from donors. Receivables expected to be collected within 12 months of the end of the reporting period are classified as current assets. All other receivables are classified as non-current assets.



### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2020

#### (d) Employee Benefits

Provision is made for the association's liability for employee benefits arising from services rendered by employees to the end of the reporting period. Employee benefits that are expected to be settled within one year have been measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liability is settled. Employee benefits payable later than one year have been measured at the present value of the estimated future cash outflows to be made for those benefits. In determining the liability, consideration is given to employee wage increases and the probability that the employee may not satisfy vesting requirements. Those cash flows are discounted using market yields on national government bonds with terms to maturity that match the expected timing of cash flows.

#### (e) Provisions

Provisions are recognised when the association has a legal or constructive obligation, as a result of past events, for which it is probable that an outflow of economic benefits will result and that outflow can be reliably measured.

Provisions are measured using the best estimate of the amounts required to settle the obligation at the end of the reporting period.

#### (f) Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

#### (g) Revenue and Other Income

Non-reciprocal grant revenue is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income when the association obtains control of the grant and it is probable that the economic benefits gained from the grant will flow to the association and the amount of the grant can be measured reliably.

If conditions are attached to the grant which must be satisfied before it is eligible to receive the contribution, the recognition of the grant as revenue will be deferred until those conditions are satisfied.

When grant revenue is received whereby the association incurs an obligation to deliver economic value directly back to the contributor, this is considered a reciprocal transaction and the grant revenue is recognised in the statement of financial position as a liability until the service has been delivered to the contributor, otherwise the grant is recognised as income on receipt

The association receives non-reciprocal contributions of assets from the government and other parties for zero or a nominal value. These assets are recognised at fair value on the date of acquisition in the statement of financial position, with a corresponding amount of income recognised in the statement of comprehensive income.

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2020

Donations and bequests are recognised as revenue when received.

Revenue from the rendering of a service is recognised upon the delivery of the service to the customer.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

#### (h) Accounts Payable and Other Payables

Accounts payable and other payables represent the liability outstanding at the end of the reporting period for goods and services received by the association during the reporting period that remain unpaid. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

#### (i) Goods and Services Tax (GST)

Revenues, expenses and assets are recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Tax Office. In these circumstances the GST is recognised as part of the cost of acquisition of the asset or as part of an item of the expense. Receivables and payables in the statement of financial position are shown inclusive of GST.
